One set version

I would never use this for an archive because there can be many changes. It just doesn't make sense because I'm used to the left set being a large change.

When the left set changes, the other sets go back to zero.

Two set version

It's possible to have just two sets of numbers for an archive version. The example is 1.0 or 2.3. This versioning works well if there isn't a 1, 2, and maybe even 3 version succession that will always be.

For example, HTML Template 1 will always be HTML Template 1, and HTML Template 2 and HTML Template 3 are the same. In this case denoting large changes in a middle set makes sense because it makes for being better informed.

Three set version

Example: 1.2.5

Using a three set number works well if the left set number will always be that number. (Refer to Two set version.) Use the middle set to demarcate significant change.
